Welcome back, I hope you all had a lovely Easter break.

Topics

This term our class topics will be Spring, growing and "The Very Hungry Caterpillar". Some of the activities planned will include growing cress, sunflowers and beans. We will be looking at the sunflowers painting by Vincent Van Gogh and will be painting and drawing our own representation of this.

After the half term, our topic will be Summer, 'Commotion in the Ocean' and our last few weeks will be "fun and play".

We will be doing music for the whole term at Norwich School as well as games and will be using the outdoor classroom when possible.

Show and Tell

We will be continuing with our weekly "Show and Tell" on a Friday when children can bring in any item from home to show the class; this might be a photograph, toy, special object, medal or certificate of achievement. This is a great activity for developing social and speaking and listening skills and the children really enjoying doing this.

Uniform

As the weather is slowly starting to improve, please ensure all children are prepared for all weathers. They still need to bring a school coat every day in case of wet weather, **named** suncream (minimum SPF 30) and a school sunhat. Please can all items of uniform be cleared named. Games kit is to be worn to school on Monday for games at Norwich School and on Thursday for swimming at Norwich High School.



Packed lunches

Could I request again that parents do not send in hot or tinned food on a Monday or Thursday as the children have lunch slightly later on Monday and earlier on a Friday to allow their lunch to settle before swimming. Lighter lunches are better so please avoid heavy foods such as pasta, rice, pizza and nuggets. Can I also remind all parents that children **must not** send in foods containing fish due to a child with a life-threatening shell allergy.
